A Message from Monte...

You have determined that the pool is not leaking, but is there a leak somewhere else?

Use the Water Meter Test

There are some obvious signs of a water leak -- visible water, water flooding a house or yard. These usually indicate a broken, pressurized water pipe. But there are some not-so-obvious signs of a leaking, concealed pipe, including:

- The sound of running water when no water should be running (could be a leak in your slab)
- The water meter spinning when no water is being used on the property
- Water continuously flowing from yard drains or across the sidewalk
- The swimming pool water level dropping or the auto-fill constantly running
- A hot spot on the floor
- Cracks in walls or floors (caused by a leak in your slab)
- Mildew or excessive moisture under carpets (again, could be a slab leak)
- Unusually high water bills (could be a slab leak or leak in a wall or pool)
- The water company informs you that the average water usage is above normal.
- Irrigation systems are also a source for water leaks, shutting the irrigation supply valve can determine if the leak is in this system

If any of these symptoms exist, try the Water Meter Test. You'll need to conduct the test for 30 minutes when no water is being used anywhere on the property. Here's how:

Find your city water meter.







- Check the triangle or star-shaped leak indicator for movement. If it spins, this indicates a possible leak in the system.
- If the meter is not spinning, water is not moving through the meter.
- Write down the numbers indicated on the meter at the start of this test.
- Return to check the meter reading in 30 minutes.
- If the numbers did not change, you don't have a leak in your pressurized water system. If the number have changed, continue with the following steps.
- Shut off the valves at every toilet in the house and repeat steps 1 4.

If the numbers have not changed, you may have a running toilet that should be serviced by a plumber. If the numbers have changed, this indicates water consumption even though water was not being used during the test. You may need a leak detection test!

Capital Valley IPSSA Begins Swim and Safety Program

CVIPSSA has partnered with the <u>Sunrise Recreation and Park District</u> to expand the District's swim and safety programs. The program's objective is to make swimming lessons and water safety education accessible to immigrant and low income children in the local community. CVIPSSA's grant will benefit approximately 25 children and their families who would not otherwise have the means to take swimming lessons.

Participants will receive 16 thirty-minute swim lessons over 4 weeks for the children and two River and Lake Safety Days for the whole family. During the River and Lake Safety Days, they will learn how to use a life jacket, and various water safety ideas, e.g. swim with a buddy and using assists for struggling swimmers. The information is similar to a standard American Red Cross Basic Water Rescue class. The local DART (Drowning Accident and Rescue Team) will attend the Safety Days, participate in the instruction, explain their mission to the families, and show the kids their rescue equipment.

CVIPSSA is excited about this partnership and bringing a successful outreach program to the Antelope Aquatic Complex. This grass-roots program will promote the drowning prevention mission that all of us embrace as aquatics professionals.

Legislative Update

SB 993 - Would require all businesses that do not meet certain exemptions to levy and pay a sales tax on their services.

SB 606 and AB 1668 would help implement the Governor's Water Plan as law. Included in this plan, and the pieces of legislation that would enforce it, is language granting power to the State Water Resources Control Board to require long-term efficient water use standards for indoor and outdoor residential use, up to and including quotas on usage.

AB 1938 - would prohibit an employer from inquiring about whether a job candidate has children.

AB 2705 - would create a 2 year statute of limitations for claims of non-payment of workers' compensation by contractors.

SB 1272 - would help fight the underground economy. This hurts the pool industry by skirting the laws on taxes, workers' compensation, licensing and more, creating an unfair marketplace in which it is increasingly difficult to compete.
