Snakes! This year it seems that several pool service techs have been seeing a larger quantity of rattle snakes by the equipment or even in the skimmers. Over the years I have serviced swimming pools that I have had to remove snakes from the skimmers. It is easy to forget, but every time vou empty a skimmer basket make sure to look first for any snakes. More often than not they are already dead, but sometimes they would jump up at you or go back down in the skimmer basket and wait. Now what? I normally grab them

with a big pair of channel locks and throw it over the fence and let the neighbor deal with it. (Just kidding!) If it is a rattler snake I normally end up killing the poor thing and dispose of it. I'm not a big fan of rattle snakes they are just a pest to me. If it is a harmless snake I just let it go in a field. I also tell the home owner to watch out for any other signs of snakes. Snakes can be discouraged by dogs and cats, but make sure the dog or cat food is put up and not left out. Left out food can attract mice and mice = snake food.

Keeping the yard clean, maintained, and the equipment pad clean will also help remove any hiding places for the snakes. Removing hiding places such as wood piles, leaves, and vegetation will help remove mice which will also remove snake food.

Mileage Increase to 55.5 cents per mile


The Internal Revenue Service announced an increase in the optional standard mileage rates for the final six months of 2011. Taxpayers may use the optional standard rates to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business and other purposes. The rate will increase to 55.5 cents a mile for all business miles driven from July 1, 2011, through Dec. 31, 2011. This is an increase of 4.5 cents from the 51 cent rate in effect for the first six months of 2011.

Sales Tax Decrease by 1%

Effective July 1, 2011, the statewide sales and use tax rate will decrease lowering the statewide base tax rate from 8.25 to 7.25 percent, unless the Legislature extends the tax rate increase before July 1, 2011. In areas where there are voter-approved district taxes, the total tax rate related to sales and purchases will be the statewide base tax rate of 7.25 percent plus the applicable district tax. Please check the Board of Equalization's website for any updates.
